CHAPTER 3: SERIES OF MARKS

3.1 SERIES OF TRADE MARKS

3.1.1 A series of trademarks refer to a set of marks which resemble each other in their material particulars but differ in non-distinctive elements. This allows the applicant to protect a range of related marks under a single registration.

3.1.2 Section 21 of Trademarks Act 2019 and Regulation 38 of the Trademark Regulations govern the registration of a series of marks.

Section 21(1) of the Trade Marks Act 1976 provides:

(1) A person may make a single application under subsection 17(2) for the registration of a number of trademarks if the trademarks -

- (a) resemble each other in material particulars; and
- (b) differ only in respect of one or more of the following matters:
 - (i) statements or representations as to the goods or services in relation to which the trademarks are used or intended to be used;
 - (ii) statements or representations as to number, price or quality;
 - (iii) standard fonts which do not substantially affect the identity of the trademarks; or the colour of any part of the trademark.

(2) If the application meets all the requirements under subsection (1), the Registrar shall register the trademarks as a

series in one registration.

(3) A trademark which has been registered as part of a series trademark may be used independently.

3.2 REQUIREMENTS FOR SERIES OF TRADEMARKS

3.2.1 To qualify as a series of trade marks, the following requirements must be satisfied:

- (a) Each mark in the series must resemble each of the others in the series in their material particulars, that is, the main features in each of the trade mark must be essentially the same.
- (b) The differences between the marks must comprise only matters which, when considered as a separate element of the mark, be non-distinctive in nature.
- (c) The differences between the trademarks must not comprise matters which, in the context of the trade mark as a whole, substantially affect the identity of the trade marks.
 - (i) This is the over-riding requirement the differences between the marks must not substantially affect their identity. The test is not merely whether the marks in the series would be regarded as confusingly similar to each other if used by unrelated undertakings. Even if the marks are confusingly similar, the marks may still not qualify as a series.
 - (ii) Any variation in the non-distinctive features in the marks must leave the visual, phonetic and conceptual identity of each of the trademarks substantially the same. Even if the marks are conceptually similar, they will not constitute a series if there are substantial differences in the visual or aural identities of the marks.

- (iii) The assessment of whether the identity of the marks is substantially affected is based on the likely reaction to the marks of an average consumer of the goods/services in question.

3.3 APPLICATION PROCESS FOR SERIES OF TRADEMARKS

3.3.1 To register a series of trademarks, the applicant must:

3.4 EXAMPLES OF ALLOWED SERIES

3.4.1 Uppercase and Lowercase Variations

In order for the marks to be acceptable as a series, differences in uppercase and lowercase letters must not result in the marks being perceived or pronounced differently.

3.4.2 Variations in Stylizations

Variations in stylization should be minimal and non-distinctive in nature, so that the differences do not substantially affect the identity of the marks in the series.

3.4.3 Conventional Fonts




For marks containing textual elements, the use of different scripts or fonts is acceptable as a series, provided that the scripts or fonts are conventional and not fanciful or elaborate in their styling.


3.4.4 Fanciful Stylizations

A word mark which contains stylised letters may be acceptable in a series, provided that the stylization is not overly fanciful and does not render the marks substantially different in identity from the rest of the series.

3.4.5 Symbols and Special Characters

Where the marks in a series contain symbol(s) or special character(s), the series is acceptable provided that the symbol or special character does not substantially alter the visual, aural, or conceptual identity of the marks.

3.4.6 Punctuation

Punctuation is used to provide sense, clarity, and emphasis in sentences. Punctuation marks help structure and organise a phrase or sentence. Where the marks in a series differ in their punctuation, the series is acceptable provided that the punctuation does not substantially alter the visual, aural, or conceptual identities of the marks.

3.4.7 Positioning of Elements

In order to qualify as a series, differences in the positioning of elements within the marks must not substantially affect the overall identity of the series of marks.




3.4.8 Cartoon Characters in Series of Trademarks

When assessing whether marks comprising cartoon characters are acceptable as a series, the following factors are considered:

- Overall appearance of the characters
- Clothing worn by the characters
- Props used or held by the characters
- Names ascribed to the characters
- Positions assumed by the characters
- Activities undertaken by the characters
- The extent to which the props, clothing, names, and/or activities dominate the mark.

For example : The marks below fullfills the factors listed above.

3.4.9 Colour Variations in Series of Trademarks

Differences in colour in the elements of the marks are acceptable in a series only if the colours do not substantially affect the identities of the marks.

The criterion for marks to be acceptable as a series is not about the size of the element in which the colour difference lies, or whether the marks would be seen as pointing to the same trade source. Even if the colour difference lies within a minor portion of the marks or if it is clear that the marks belong to the same trade source, the marks may still be found to be unacceptable as a series if there are substantial differences in the identities of the marks.




3.4.10 Chinese Characters in Series of Trademarks - Traditional and Simplified Chinese Characters

Where the marks in a series contain Chinese characters, their acceptability as a series may include both traditional and simplified forms of the same Chinese character(s), provided that the differences do not substantially affect the overall identity of the marks.

This means that a traditional character and its simplified counterpart should retain the same pronunciation, meaning, and general appearance. If there are substantial differences in form or significance, the marks may not be considered a series.




3.4.11 Colour difference in marks consisting of device(s)



The addition of colours to simple shapes will occasionally add distinctiveness to an otherwise non-distinctive mark. In such cases, the marks will not qualify as a series given that a distinctive element of

the mark, that is, the colour, is not the same in all of the marks. This principle is illustrated in the following examples:

3.4.12 Background






Variations to backgrounds in a series of marks may be permissible if the backgrounds are merely a subordinate and non-distinctive feature of the marks and the difference in backgrounds does not substantially affect the identity of the marks.

3.5 EXAMPLES OF SERIES NOT ALLOWED

3.5.1 The representation of trademark images cannot be accepted as a series when the differences between the marks vary in their position and meaning.
